Elizabeth Burr, Ph.D. Jungian Analyst (Zurich)

Liza taught at Metropolitan State University in the Department of Ethnic and Religious Studies from 2002 to 2015, and teaches occasionally at St. Catherine University in the Theology Department (both located in Saint Paul). A graduate of the C. G. Jung Institute of Zurich (1997), she has a private practice at her home in Saint Paul. She translated the *Chiron Dictionary of Greek and Roman Mythology* (1994) from German into English as well as an unpublished collection of lectures by Helene Hoerni-Jung on seventeen icons of Mary. She is the secondary coauthor of *Understanding World Religions: A Road Map for Justice and Peace* (2007), and coreviser of the book's second edition, published in 2015. She is interested in the intersection of Jungian psychology, religion, and social justice activism. A core faculty member, she served for ten years as the MSJS seminar coordinator.

Peggy L. Hanson, Psy.D., L.P. Jungian Analyst (IRSJA)

Peggy started her career as a school psychologist, followed by over twenty years of practice as a clinical psychologist. She completed her training as a Jungian analyst in 2015 and has a private practice in downtown Northfield, Minnesota. She is the currently the coordinator of the Minnesota Seminar in Jungian Studies and facilitator for its case colloquium. Her not so secret passions include treehouses, literally and symbolically, and solitary walks in nature, with favorite retreats in Minnesota and Maine.

Laraine Kurisko, Ph.D., L.P. Jungian Analyst (Chicago)

Mary Ann was active for many years as a faculty person in the Inter-Regional Society of Jungian Analysts. A core faculty member of the MSJS, she has served as its coordinator and is currently its secretary.

Janet Muff, M.S.N., R.N. Jungian Analyst (Los Angeles)

Janet is a senior analyst and faculty member of the C. G. Jung Institute of Los Angeles and of the Inter-Regional Society of Jungian Analysts. She has been studying the *Atalanta Fugiens* for more than twenty years. Through the two-way "conversation" that has developed during that time, the events in her life have brought understanding and meaning to this alchemical manuscript and, in return, the manuscript has brought understanding and meaning to her life and analytic work.

Judith Savage, LICSW, LMFT Jungian Analyst (IRSJA)

Judith is a Jungian analyst in private practice in Saint Paul, a licensed independent clinical social worker, and a marriage and family therapist. She has served on the Board of Directors of the Minnesota Association of Marriage and Family Therapists. Mark Winborn, Ph.D., NCPsyA Jungian Analyst (IRSJA)

Mark is a Jungian Psychoanalyst and Clinical Psychologist. He received his BS in Psychology from Michigan State University in 1982, his MS and PhD in Clinical Psychology from the University of Memphis in 1987, and his certificate in Jungian Analysis from the Inter-Regional Society of Jungian Analysts in 1999. From 1988 – 1990 he was the staff psychologist at the United States Military Academy, West Point, New York. Dr. Winborn is a training/supervising analyst of the Inter-Regional Society of Jungian Analysts and the C.G. Jung Institute in Zurich, Switzerland. He currently serves on the American Board for Accreditation in Psychoanalysis and

the Ethics Committee of the International Association for Analytical Psychology. Dr. Winborn is on the editorial boards of the Journal of Analytical Psychology and the Journal of Humanistic Psychology, as well as being a member of the National Association for the Advancement of Psychoanalysis.

His publications include *Deep Blues: Human Soundscapes for the Archetypal Journey* (2011) and *Shared Realities: Participation Mystique and Beyond* (2014), both with Fisher King Press, as well as journal articles, book reviews, and chapter contributions. Routledge Press has contracted to publish Dr. Winborn's third book, *Interpretation in Jungian Analysis: Art and Technique* (forthcoming). He has also presented papers at the past three Congresses of the International Association for Analytical Psychology (Montreal 2010, Copenhagen 2013, Kyoto 2016). Since 1990 he has maintained a private practice in Memphis, Tennessee, USA where he was the Training Coordinator for the Memphis-Atlanta Jungian Seminar from 2010 - 2016. In addition to his teaching activities in Memphis, he has been an invited presenter for Jungian societies, training seminars and institutes in Atlanta, Austin, Charleston, Chicago, Columbus, Santa Fe, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Florida, Lafayette, New Orleans, Houston, Minneapolis, the Dominican Republic, Moscow (Russia) and the IRSJA candidate group.

Medora Woods has been an attorney, a high school English teacher, a psychologist and a Jungian analyst since 1997. Her interest in astrology began many years ago.
